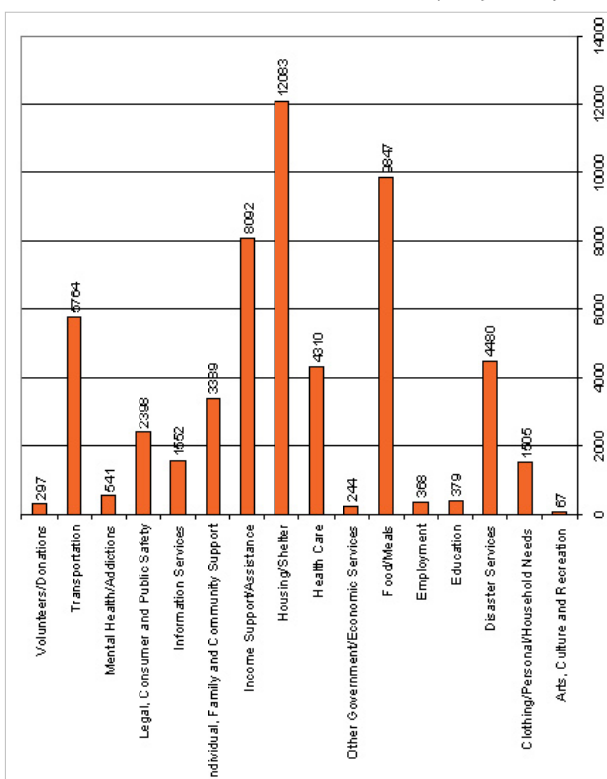

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Answered 58,137 calls in West Central's 2-1-1 Texas Area Information Center in 2010.
- Produced and sold more than 200 copies of the 2010 Helpline Resource Directory. The directory includes more than 1,500 services in the 19 counties of West Central Texas.
- Increased the number of area resources in the database and completed a formal audit of every service to verify database accuracy and ensure organizations meet inclusion/exclusion policy.
- Secured three-year contract to serve as the 2-1-1 Texas Area Information Center for West Central Texas and as one of three "Warm Centers" in the state that are first to ramp up to respond to statewide disaster events.
- Continued hosting quarterly "Basic Needs Network" meetings. This collaboration of more than 40 organizations works together to better meet the needs of individuals and families in the region by tracking service delivery on a web-based client case management tool.
- Established the Military Partnership of West Central Texas. The partnership organization's quarterly meetings are facilitated by 2-1-1 Texas A Call for Help. Members are committed to improving service access and the development of services to address the unmet needs of military families in West Central Texas.
- Alicia Lee, Resource Database Manager and Systems Administrator, was named 2010 Texas Database Manager of the Year.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Assumed management of the Individual Development Account program in October 2010. Funded through the Office of Community Services Administration for Children & Families and private matching funds, participants attend financial literacy courses, save at least \$1,000 and receive a 4 to 1 match to purchase a home, pursue education or support a small business.
- Prepared 725 income tax returns, saving families \$102,750 in tax preparation fees. Families received Earned Income and Child Tax Credits totaling \$518,405 and received overall refunds totaling \$1,337,444.
- Launched Money Power Hour, a monthly brown-bag lunch event, featuring local business and financial experts who provide encouragement and practical advice.
