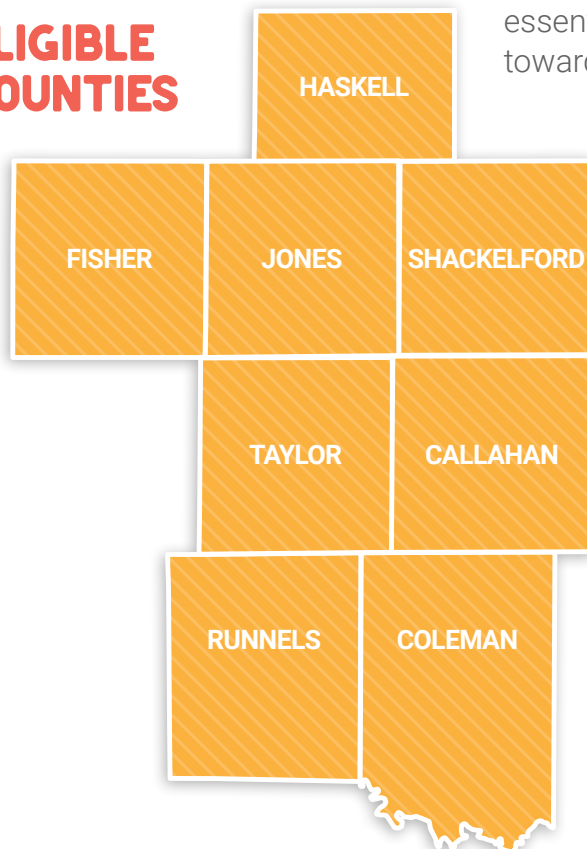
IMAGINATION LIBRARY

United Way of Abilene is proud to support **Dolly Parton's Imagination Library**, a program that provides free, high-quality books to children from birth to age five. Since launching in **May 2023**, this initiative has helped ensure that every child, regardless of background, has access to the resources they need to develop a love for reading. By placing books directly into the hands of young children, we are fostering a foundation for future success in school and beyond. Since Imagination Library was brought to the Big Country, more than **77,403 books** have been mailed out to children.



In 2024, thanks to the generosity of our donors and community partners, the Imagination Library has delivered **47,359 books** to **5,754 children** across the Big Country. Research shows that children who grow up with books in their homes are more likely to develop essential language and literacy skills, setting them on a path toward lifelong learning.

The success of this initiative is made possible through the collaborative efforts of local organizations and businesses, including child care providers, public libraries, hospitals, school districts, and employers, who help raise awareness and connect eligible families to the program. By working together, these partners play a vital role in ensuring that more children have access to books during their critical early years. Their commitment to literacy strengthens the broader community and creates new opportunities for young learners.

Generous support from donors has also helped sustain and expand this work, making it possible for books to reach children at no cost to their families. As enrollment continues to grow, so does the impact of those who give their time, resources, and advocacy to support early childhood education. Through these efforts, more children in the Big Country area will have the opportunity to dream big—one book at a time.
